2.	No procedures in place for social distancing players and officials not adhering to social distancing procedures	 All players and officials will be made aware of the risks of participation and that these will increase if social distancing protocols are not followed; A maximum of 30 players, coaches and officials from both sides will be permitted for any game; Players, coaches and officials should limit the time congregating prior to a match to minimize the risk of spreading infection; Entrance and exit points to the ground and car parking will be clearly identified; There will be limited access to the changing rooms, with a maximum of 2 players / officials in each room at any one time to provide appropriate social distancing. Players using the changing room must comply with the Offham CC 'Changing and showering policy', giving junior members priority. The policy can be found on the club website. Players may put their kit in the changing rooms for the duration of the game, but can only access it in line with the changing room regulation as outlined above. The front doors to the pavilion and all internal and external changing room doors will remain open, at all times possible, to ensure maximum ventilation through the building. Access to and from the toilets will be via the pavilion front doors. No more than two people may use the toilets at any one time. Hands must be washed after use and paper towels provided for drying must be disposed of appropriately; If there is more than one scorer, they must sit at least 2 metres apart. 		 All players and officials must be 2 metres apart on the field of play, including during breaks in play, except a) wicket keepers standing up to the stumps b) slip fielders where 1+ metres must be applied wherever possible; Should there be a rain break players, officials and spectators should preferably sit in their car. Admission to the pavilion will not be allowed; When applying the covers players will adhere to social distancing guidance; Appropriate sanctions, in line with guidance issued by Association of Cricket Officials, will be applied for participants not adhering to COVID-19 guidance. This includes player ejection and match cancellation; Where travel to away games is by car this must be in accordance with the government guidance for safer travel. The club will provide additional sanitiser and wipes for all site users; No food and drink will be provided for 'tea' and players should bring their own. Players must bring personal refreshments for use during the game; Players should only use their own equipment. If playing equipment is shared it must be carefully cleaned before and after use by each player. One person will be designated to clean the shared equipment; Bats and wicket keeper gloves will be sanitised after use; Players and officials will use hand sanitiser before, during and after the game, particularly before consumption of food. 		 No sweat or saliva may be applied to the ball. Participants will not be permitted to spit whilst participating; There will be a hygiene break every six overs or every 20 minutes (whichever is soonest) to allow the ball to be cleaned using antibacterial wipes that kill the virus; Where possible players will minimise sharing of the ball by limiting contact as the ball is returned to the bowler; Players will not hand any personal items to the umpire. They should themselves put items on the boundary; The umpire will not handle the ball. At each break or fall of wicket the ball will be placed at the base of the stumps; Umpires will only be responsible for the set of stumps closest to them; 	fees by cash wherever possible.

Social distancing and precautionary hygiene measures not being followed by club members and spectators not participating in the match	 Spectators may attend the game, but in the area adjacent to the pavilion must sit in the designated area in groups of no more than 30 people, socially distance as required; Spectators may also be seated in the area between the nets and Brooker Gate. They can also circumnavigate the ground providing they socially distance from players and other spectators; Spectator's may access to the pavilion to use the toilets, but players and officials must be given priority during the game. The designated entrance and exit will be used at all times. No more than two people may use the toilets at any one time. Hands must be washed after use and paper towels provided for drying must be disposed of appropriately; No food and drink will be provided for 'tea', spectators should bring their own. The club will provide additional sanitizer and wipes for spectators; Spectators will be asked to refrain from touching the ball.

If the illness relates to a visiting player the opposition captain will notify the OCC captain, who will notify all OCC participating players and officials.
